Mike T. and his loved ones were treated to a private tour of the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown.



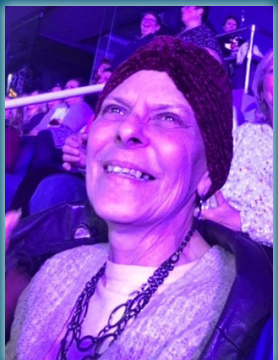
Cathy W. and her friend watched a taping of The View television show and enjoyed the sights in NYC.

When you receive an Experience from Night Out For You, you become part of the family. We would be remiss not to recognize and send our condolences to the families of those Recipients who have passed away this year.



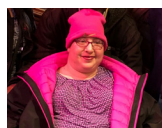

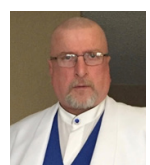
